

A place we call home

Chesterfield is where communities flourish

Located on the edge of the Peak District, our town offers an exceptional quality of life. Chesterfield has been ranked the Happiest Town in the East Midlands for two years running by Rightmove¹.

We boast award-winning parks and green spaces and are listed in the UK's top 20 greenest towns and cities². In fact, 95% of all homes and flats in Chesterfield have green space - on average 249 square metres, which is the highest proportion of any area in the country³.

We are investing in our iconic theatres. We have modern leisure attractions like escape rooms and axe throwing, and a vibrant café culture. Residents benefit from being in the centre of the country, situated right alongside the M1 motorway with direct rail access to many major cities.

Building for our future

We invest in new homes and regeneration through strong public-private partnerships

Staveley and Mastin Moor will see 2,000 new homes, with hundreds more to be built near our town centre at Chesterfield Waterside.

In 2024, an innovative construction training site opened at Mastin Moor. Known as the Construction Skills Hub⁴, the site offers hands-on construction training, career activities, and work experience opportunities, equipping local learners with the skills our town needs.

Chesterfield Borough Council continues to work closely with developers and partners to ensure high-quality, sustainable developments and to ensure that construction benefits the local community through labour clauses and skills programmes.

In total, over 750 jobs were created on development sites across Chesterfield last year. This figure includes 400 local people and 50 apprentices.

A perfect environment for business

Our successful businesses offer plenty of opportunities when it comes to skilled employment

Business confidence in Chesterfield remains high, with over 1,000 new businesses registered in 2024⁵. Our town is home to more than 3,330 enterprises, and 84% of our residents are economically active; that's 5% higher than the rest of the UK⁶.

The development of the new East Midlands Investment Zone in Staveley will increase the number of skilled occupations in advanced manufacturing, engineering, rail and green industries.

Other key growth sectors include property and construction, health and care, and professional services.

20 years of Markham Vale

From a former colliery to a thriving business hub, Markham Vale has celebrated 20 years of transformation and continues to grow

The 200-acre site now houses over 70 businesses and supports more than 2,700 jobs, with even more on the way. It houses diverse enterprises, from advanced manufacturers like MSE Hiller to global creative company, Noonah.

Further development is coming to the scheme, including:

- Nova: two large industrial and logistics units totalling more than 700,000 sq. ft.
- Markham Vale Trade Park: A 31,264 sq. ft commercial scheme.
- Ark units: industrial and logistics units totalling 110,000 sq. ft.
- Gridserve Electric Forecourt: will provide 30 charging points for cars, electric lorries and other HGVs, as well as shops and a café.

Our people ooze creativity

Chesterfield is a town that thrives on creativity, culture, and innovation, providing a platform for local talent to shine

The Animate Chesterfield public art programme is bringing communities together to create an authentic celebration of the town, leaving a lasting cultural legacy.

Meanwhile, The Rose Theatre is undergoing a remarkable transformation. Thanks to fundraising efforts, Chesterfield Studios and Diane Bradbury Dance School have acquired the former Rose Hill Church, turning it into a dynamic centre for dance, musical theatre, and singing providing more space for its 400 students.

West Studios recently marked a decade as a hub for creative businesses, collaborating closely with Chesterfield College to support artistic growth. While the Stephenson Memorial Hall undergoes refurbishment, the Museum on the Move initiative brings history to life across the borough.

Chesterfield's creative talent is also making waves on a global stage. Local marketing company, Noonah took centre stage at the 2024 Eurovision Song Contest, helping contestants create unforgettable social media content.

Looking ahead, Derbyshire Makes, a three-year cultural programme, will celebrate innovation in making, from design and craft to manufacturing.

We are a town of makers

Our town has a proud heritage of making, building, and innovating

Manufacturing represents 9% of all employment in our town, well above the national average of 4.5%.

Just a few of the products made here include holiday lodges, industrial centrifuges and weighbridges, industrial paint, cast iron bars and sustainable packaging.

Our manufacturing and engineering businesses collaborate and share best practice through initiatives like the Chesterfield Manufacturing Forum⁷.

In 2024, two of our manufacturers achieved the King's Awards for Enterprise:

 United Cast Bar was recognised for outstanding achievements in international trade. As one of the world's leading manufacturers of continuous cast iron bars, UCB exemplifies our town's industrial expertise and global reach.

 Heraeus Electro-Nite received the award for innovation after setting new standards in advanced sensor technology for steelmaking. Its approach showcases Chesterfield's reputation for cutting-edge manufacturing.

Our businesses are encouraged to innovate and grow. Chesterfield Borough Council supported 300 businesses in 2024, while 65 local entrepreneurs were supported to start a business8.

Unlocking new opportunities

Our manufacturing and green sectors will receive a transformative boost with the announcement of a new East Midlands Investment Zone

The £160m initiative, overseen by the East Midlands Combined County Authority, is designed to support advanced manufacturing and green industries.

One of the proposed investment zone locations is the Hartington Staveley site, which is primed for transformation into a hub of cutting-edge industry and sustainable development.

Companies which invest here could see significant tax incentives, helping to deliver substantial job opportunities, and fuelling further local employment and economic activity.

On the right track for growth

Chesterfield's ambitions to be a leading location for the UK rail sector continue to gather pace.

This year, Positive Traction received an order for its innovative zero-carbon Class 08E shunter engine.

Heidelberg Materials, which supplies heavy building materials, will use the new vehicle to support internal rail operations at one of the UK's leading quarry facilities.

Meanwhile, a new rail innovation and training centre⁹ will be built next to the historic Barrow Hill Roundhouse. It will provide state-of-the-art training areas to equip our people with skills for the rail sector. We look forward to the site boosting research and development through its digital laboratory.

Furthermore, commercial workshop space will attract new businesses to the area and develop our rail sector.

The project will see the creation of 22 job opportunities for local people and increase awareness of rail-related career opportunities. It will serve as a hub for rail innovation, research and development.

We are investing in our environment and communities

Some of the organisations supporting Chesterfield to become more sustainable include:

Kakou: supporting local businesses with Net Zero and ESG expertise, including governance and policy, low-carbon technology development and accreditation.

Chesterfield Borough Council: committed to become a carbon-neutral organisation by 2030 and create a carbon-neutral borough by 2050.

Derbyshire Wildlife Trust: the Wild Whittington project will see the re-wilding of 60 acres of land for nature to thrive and future generations to enjoy.

Derbyshire County Council: leading a project to create Derbyshire's Heartwood Community Forest on the eastern fringe of the county, covering Chesterfield and Staveley.

Green Arch Consulting: supported businesses of all sizes around the globe with sustainability consultancy and ESG reporting. Recent clients include FTSE 250 listed JLEN and the Central Bank of Nigeria.

Monkey Park CIC: using part of the park to enhance biodiversity – helping to create habitats for a range of creatures including bees, butterflies, birds, and many more.

Custom Solar: based in Chesterfield, this solar panel installation business has supported several local companies to adopt renewable energy on their premises, including a solar canopy at its Sheepbridge office.

Supporting future talent

We're developing a town where young people can dream big, develop their potential, and build thriving careers

Local initiatives are addressing skills gaps by inspiring our young people and helping them to become 'work ready'. Key growth sectors with strong career opportunities include manufacturing and engineering, property and construction, green industries, health and care, and professional services.

Manufacturing Futures: training sessions for sector leaders in supporting and mentoring our young people and apprentices¹⁰.

Made in Chesterfield: showcasing careers in the manufacturing sector to more than 3,000 young people in the last 10 years, with businesses opening their premises for visits and tours¹¹.

Careers Made in Chesterfield: linking employers with future talent by engaging with local schools, supporting our students to become 'work ready'12.

We love to learn

Our people want to grow, so we're keen to connect businesses to the latest upskilling opportunities

The Chesterfield Skills Brokerage Service¹³ helps businesses identify skills gaps and highlights the most relevant training opportunities. The free service provides information about funding for skills, including technical education and apprenticeships up to degree level.

Some of the funded training over the past year has included management, digital and cyber security, and green skills.

The skills brokerage initiative also offers advice on retention and inclusive recruitment, which was a key focus of the 2025 Chesterfield Employability and Skills Conference¹⁴.

A base to explore the Peak District

We're excited that construction has started to create PEAK Gateway resort

There are already 3.7 million visitors every year to Chesterfield, spending £177 million and supporting 2,300 jobs locally. PEAK has the potential to achieve a development value of over £1 billion and sustain thousands of jobs.

PEAK proposes the UK's first purpose-built national park gateway 'resort town,' offering visitors world-class facilities as a base from which to access the 550 square mile National Park. Like a ski resort, PEAK Gateway wants visitors to explore and aims to connect the site to trails and country lanes of the Peak District without a car. It aims to establish the area as the largest integrated off-and on-road cycling and hiking region in the UK.

Once completed, PEAK will boast 2,000 hotel rooms, 250 holiday lodges and its own energy park. The first phase is scheduled to open to visitors in 2027/8.

Preserving our heritage for future generations

We love our historic market and architecture as much as the contemporary spaces we are creating

Our beloved Stephenson Memorial Hall, which dates to the Victorian Era, is being restored thoughtfully. The multi-million-pound project will reopen the historic entrance and bring together an extended theatre, a reconfigured and modern museum, alongside new gallery space, a café bar, education and community facilities.

On our doorstep, Hardwick Hall stands tall, while Chatsworth House continues to impress with its elegance.

The restoration of Chesterfield Canal will provide a picturesque space for lovers of the great outdoors to explore, either on foot, by bike, or even out on the water. Thanks to funding from the Staveley Town Deal project, Chesterfield Canal Trust is upgrading the canal and towpath throughout 2025.

Of course, our iconic Crooked Spire continues to attract 90,000 visitors throughout the year¹⁸ and is complemented by our town centre's Georgian architecture and narrow shopping streets.

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
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
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
